Veber Partners, LLC has developed a Business Continuity Plan on how we will respond to events that significantly disrupt our business. This plan is reviewed annually and updated as necessary. Since the timing and impact of disasters and disruptions is unpredictable, we will have to be flexible in responding to actual events as they occur. With that in mind, we are providing you with this information on our business continuity plan.

**Contacting us** — If after a significant business disruption you cannot contact us as you usually do at 503-229-4400 or by any of our email addresses, you should call our alternative number, 503-467-8896, or go to our website at [www.veber.com](http://www.veber.com).

**Our Business Continuity Plan** — We plan to quickly recover and resume business operations after a significant disruption and respond by safeguarding our employees and property, making a financial and operational assessment, protecting the firm's books and records, and allowing our customers to transact business. In short, our business continuity plan is designed to permit our firm to resume operations as quickly as possible, given the scope and severity of the significant business disruption.

Our business continuity plan addresses: data back up and recovery; all mission critical systems; financial and operational assessments; alternative communications with customers, employees, and regulators; alternate physical location of employees; critical supplier, contractor, bank and counter-party impact; regulatory reporting; and assuring our customers prompt access to their funds and securities if we are unable to continue our business.

**Varying Disruptions** — Significant business disruptions can vary in their scope, such as only to our firm, the single building housing our firm, the business district where our firm is located, the city where we are located, or the whole region. Within each of these areas, the severity of the disruption can also vary from minimal to sever. In a disruption to only our firm or the building housing our firm, we will transfer our operations to local sites when needed and expect to recover and resume business within five business days. In a disruption affecting our business district, city, or region, we will transfer our operations to a site outside of the affected area, and recover and resume business within 30 business days. In either situation, we plan to continue in business and notify you through our website, [www.veber.com](http://www.veber.com), or our customer emergency number, 503-467-8896, on how to contact us. If the significant business disruption is so severe that it prevents us from remaining in business, we will assure our customer's prompt access to any records relative to private investments made through the firm.
